Special Education Local Plan Area Funding Distribution

Describe the basic premise of the SELPA Allocation Plan for distributing dollars as closely as possible to how they are earned.

Funds received by the SELPA are distributed to districts based on the district's ADA as a percent of the SELPAs total ADA. We strive to distribute funds in the same manner in which they are earned. One hundred percent (100%) of all Property Taxes is disbursed to the LEAs. SELPA funding is withheld off-the-top of state AB602 allocations for SELPA operations and administration, which is voted/approved by our Superintendents Council. Remaining amounts withheld and not spent by year-end close are returned to the districts as a percent of their ADA to the SELPA total.

Describe how the SELPA distributes IDEA revenues to the LEAs, including the models used to provide services to member LEAs:

Federal IDEA dollars are directly passed through to the districts. The SELPA does not hold any funds with the exception of Part C for Infants, which is handled by our Administrative Unit's Early Education program.
